









# **XVII Population Conference**

# Depopulation, Demographic Dynamics and Social Vulnerability

Huesca, 11-13 June 2020

#### First call

The Working Group on Population Geography of the Spanish Association of Geography (AGE), the Department of Geography and Regional Planning of the University of Zaragoza (UZ), and the GEOT Research Group (Study Group on Regional Planning, UZ), hosted by the Institute of Research into Environmental Sciences (IUCA) of the UZ, are organising the **XVII Population Conference**, which has been taking place twice yearly since 1987, and will be **International** in this call.

The conference will be held in the city of Huesca (Autonomous Community of Aragón), a small but friendly and welcoming city, and well connected by transport with Zaragoza, Barcelona or Madrid. It is the first time that the University of Zaragoza is organising this conference of the Population Group of the Spanish Association of Geography (AGE). The location of the conference will allow us to be close to depopulated areas both in the lower part of the Ribera del Ebro and others in the area of the Pyrenees, giving us the chance to visit some of them.

The **first session** will focus on the central theme of the conference: depopulation, depopulated areas and demographic revitalisation in rural areas with low population density. The inaugural lecture will be given by the writer and journalist Sergio del Molino. A round table will also be organised on this subject, including experiences of recovery of depopulated and/or empty rural villages and spaces.

The **second session** of the conference will analyse some of the dynamics and sociodemographic and territorial processes linked to the current socio-economic model in urban spaces, and especially migrations, residential mobility and other population flows. Finally, the discussions of the **third session** will focus on the processes of vulnerability of the population and the study of social groups.

The traditional **field trip** will take place on the Spanish and French sides of the Pyrenees, in order to compare the different dynamics and demographic processes in both territories, and considering the role of the railway to reinforce and enhance these spaces.

Geographical research on issues of population and territory will be welcome, but also other research coming from related disciplines, whether in oral or poster communication. In particular, researchers from other countries are also encouraged to present papers on the topics addressed by the conference.

The general official language of the conference and sessions will be Spanish, but presentation of contributions can be made in Spanish, English and French.

**Descriptors:** Population and restructuring of urban spaces; Urban inequalities; Demographic processes in the city and in metropolitan areas; Changes in the productive structure and demographic effects; Forms of business organization and demands on the labor market; New forms of tourism and their impact; Socio-spatial segregation; Technological revolution and intelligent territories; Urban governance; Real estate bubble, housing market, evictions; International and national population migration, residential mobility; Population flows; Data; New conceptualizations, approaches and methodologies.

#### Session 3: Population groups and social vulnerability.

**Descriptors:** Age groups; Inequality and social segregation; Vulnerability, educational and socioeconomic status, diversity, gender, services and attention to vulnerable groups; Public politics; Social networks; Economy and human capital; Labor markets, unemployment, income levels; Fertility; Families and homes; Life course; Health, wellbeing and morbidity; Social and collaborative economy; Determinants; Quality of life; New conceptualizations, approaches and methodologies; Measuring and analysis instruments.

#### **Abstract submission and publication of contributions:**

Presentation of contributions can be made in Spanish, English and French, and those accepted at the conference will be presented orally or as a poster. The contributions presented orally will opt for one of the following modalities:

- 1. Only oral presentation to the conference (oral or poster), without opting for publication of this presentation. In this case, the author/s will send a short summary before 15 January 2020, in a maximum of 200 words, using the attached template.
- 2. Besides sending the short summary (max. 200 words), those participants who wish to have their work published in one of the scientific journals indicated below must also send another long summary, of a maximum of 6 pages (or 5,000 words) before 30 April 2020. Short and long summaries will be evaluated by the Scientific Committee and according to the assessment, they will opt for publication as a paper in one of the monographs of these journals. Subsequently, the selected contributions will be submitted to the evaluation process, with independent referees, and by peers, according to the rules of each journal. The intention is for the monographs to be published in 2021.

During the conference, all short summaries of the participants will be available in electronic or hard copy for consultation.

The following magazines collaborate in the conference organisation, and will publish monographs on the population works presented to the conference.

AGER - Rural Development and Rural Studies, Estudios Geográficos, RIEM - International Journal of Migration Studies.
